It gives me great pleasure to present the Annual Report of Footwear Design & Development Institute (FDDI) together with the Audited Statement of Accounts and Auditor's Report for the FY 2022-23.

Since my joining of FDDI as 'Secretary' on 06th April 2023, and further to the allocation of the additional charge of Managing Director, FDDI on 21st September 2023 by the Department for Promotion of Industry & Internal Trade (DPIIT), Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India, I have been looking after all activities of FDDI across twelve campuses.

To meet the cutting edge technologies requirement such as additive manufacturing, AI application in design and data analysis, latest software's, and augmented reality application, digital enterprise, FDDI has initiated the processes of Industry 4.0 application through upgradation of seven of the existing campuses of FDDI into 'Centre of Excellence' (CoEs).

These CoEs which are having the best available infrastructure and skills to not only aid research and development, but also to address concerns of the industry like product development, technological assistance and centres for incubation and entrepreneurship development.

With respect to financial performance in FY 2022 - 23, the total income for the year is Rs.60.98 crores wherein the total expenditure for the year is Rs.72.05 crores (without depreciation of Rs.2.24 crores). The net loss for the year is Rs.13.36 crores. The increase in expenditure is due to the first major repair work undertaken FDDI campus at Kolkata, Chennai, Rohtak, and Noida.

FDDI now has its Finance and Accounts Manual having got secrutnized through NIFM, duly approved by Governing Council (GC), as FDDI was not having any Finance and Accounts Manual. The manual has been made keeping in mind accrual forms of accounting method to include all requirements and procedures for accounting and also for standardization of procedures.

The institute continues to encourage interactions with the industries to provide the students with a holistic education. During the year, besides our regular academic curriculum, several webinars, workshops & seminars were organized to build the capacity of our students. Our students have not only excelled in academics, but also won awards in national and international events in design and product development. I extend my sincere thanks to the brilliant efforts of all talented students.

The Institute is putting in extensive and painstaking effort (ongoing) to improve its expanding alumni database and alumni connect.



Footwear Design and Development Institute (FDDI) was set-up by the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India in the year 1986 for the development and promotion of Footwear and Allied Product Industries.





Over the years, FDDI expanded into education in fashion, leather products, and retail & fashion merchandise and has been playing a pivotal role in facilitating Indian industry by bridging skill gaps in the areas of footwear, leather, fashion, retail and management. FDDI has been functioning as an interface between the untapped talent and industry and its global counterparts, by fulfilling the demand of skilled manpower with its specific curriculum, state of the art laboratories, world class infrastructure and experienced faculty.



The Institute was given the status of 'Institution of National Importance' as per FDDI Act, 2017 for its contribution towards nation building by producing industry ready professionals and is serving as a 'One stop solutions provider' for footwear, leather and allied industry.

It is providing trained human resource to the industry by conducting the following long-term programmes through its 12 well-designed campuses located at Noida, Fursatganj, Chennai, Kolkata, Rohtak, Chhindwara, Guna, Jodhpur Ankleshwar, Banur, Patna and Hyderabad.

FDDI has completed 37 eventful years making significant contributions to the footwear, leather and allied industry through its academic programmes in design, technology and management, capacity building through skill up gradation to compete globally and offering technical assistance and support to the leather industry for product development, quality assurance, technology enhancement and other managerial, environmental and business solutions.

#### FDDI, NOIDA CAMPUS

Spurred by the surge in demand for trained human resource that were expected to shape the destiny of contemporary India & to harmonize the country's interests with the rest of the world in the area of footwear, leather goods and emerging marketing sector, this campus was set up in the year 1996.



The campus spread over 9 acres of land area has white dome structure with a lush green cover. Powerful beams of light and strong shadows create a dramatic and serene ambience that has inspired generations of students to achieve excellence while retaining humility.

#### FDDI, CHENNAI CAMPUS

The visiting faculty consists of top professionals in the industry from the field of Fashion Design, Footwear Design & Production Management, Visual Merchandising and Retail.

FDDI has two International Testing Centre (ITC) one in North India (Noida) & other in South India (Chennai). ITC Noida is accredited by SATRA, United Kingdom (UK), & Bureau of Indian Standards. The ITC Chennai is also having accreditation from SATRA U.K.



The centre specializes in testing of leather, leather products, footwear (Safety, Fashion and Sports), footwear components, textile products & plastics.

The ITC has full-fledged Chemical and Physical Laboratories, where all kind of chemicals and physical tests like AZO, PCP; Formaldehyde, Slip Resistance Hydrolysis etc., are performed within given Turn Around Time (TAT). The Physical laboratory was set up in collaboration with BALLY Switzerland under UNDP assistance.

Chemical laboratory has been set up in technical collaboration with PFI, Germany and is a leading testing laboratory of Asia. Both the labs have a complement of state- of-art testing equipments, duly calibrated and at par with the most demanding Industry standards.

The chemical laboratory is equipped with sophisticated instruments like High Performance Liquid Chromatography (HPLC), UV-Visible Spectrometer, Gas Chromatography Coupled with Mass Spectrometer (GC-MS), Inductively Coupled Plasma with Mass Spectrometer (ICP-MS), Gas Chromatography with ECD & processing equipment for analysis.

The tests at the laboratory are conducted as per various standards depending on the customer's requirement. Reliability and authenticity is the watchword at these centres.

Through these labs, it provides testing services to leading brands like REEBOK, NIKE, ADIDAS, PUMA, FILA, BATA, Liberty, Red Chief, Khadim, Paragon, Super House, Sketchers and many more.

To ensure right and safe purchase of Tactical Boots, Jungle Boots, Snow Boot, Ankle Boot, Sports/PT & Running Shoes, it is also providing testing services to:

The ITSC is offering centralized Email Services to all faculties & staff of various branches of FDDI. The ITSC is served by two dedicated leased line connectivity (50 Mbps + 20 Mbps) functioning in High Availability mode from one of the largest Internet Service Provider in India.



The ITSC has a dedicated IT lab at every campus with a node capacity of more than 100, equipped with latest hardware and software. The ITSC is providing Wireless Internet connectivity inside the campus, offering all-round Wi-Fi Internet connectivity to students and staff round the clock.

FDDI takes issue of wellbeing of its students very seriously & provides health care facility to the students when required in order to ensure utmost care of all.



#### PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS

#### **INCOME & EXPENDITURE**

The total income of FDDI for the FY 2022-23 is Rs.60.98 crores wherein the total expenditure for the year is Rs.72.05 Crores (without depreciation of Rs.2.24 crores) with the net loss for the year Rs.13.36 Crores.



The increase in expenditure was attributed to major repair work at Kolkata, Chennai, Rohtak, and Noida campus which was undertaken after a gap of almost ten years.

One of the major challenges that the Institute faces is that FDDI being a self-financed Institute, receives grant for Capital Expenditure only. No Revenue grant is provided resulting in operational issues. Implementation charges of Government Schemes by FDDI and continuing education programmes contribute a small portion to meet our annual expenditure.

#### ADMISSION 2022-23

To enhance the admission process, FDDI established a specialized central admission team in Noida to oversee admissions across all campuses, in addition to individual admission teams at each campus. This renewed effort aims to drive efficient and effective admissions procedures.

Efforts to increase awareness of FDDI courses among students have been intensified, both at the central and campus levels. This has been achieved through various initiatives such as school seminars, coaching institutes, education and career fairs, free counseling workshops, and design coaching collaborations.

To boost our brand and generate leads, we have executed a multi-pronged marketing campaign across various social media platforms, including Facebook, Instagram, Google Ads, and YouTube. In addition, we have integrated a chatbot on our official website to provide personalized assistance to visitors. We have also partnered with popular educational portals such as College Dekho, College Duniya, and Career360 to create dedicated pages for specific campuses and PAN India pages, and placed banner ads on their websites. To target master aspirants, we have registered with esteemed organizations such as AIMA-All India Management Association and CUET (PG). Similarly, we have registered as a scoresharing institute with UCEED and CUET (UG) to generate awareness and build our brand among undergraduate aspirants.

FDDI has also taken the initiative to register under the 'Free Ship Card' program provided by the Gujarat government. This will assist aspirants in availing of the scholarship benefits. FDDI has also initiated participation in the 'Naan Mudhalvan' scheme offered by the Tamil Nadu government.

#### **CURRICULUM REVISION**

The existing syllabus of B.Des. (FDP), B.Des. (FD), MBA (RFM) & BBA (RFM) Programmes were reviewed and updated as per the need of the Industry.

#### COMMENCEMENT OF SHORT TERM PROGRAM

Short term program- School of footwear conducted 19 short term training programs in footwear design and production and also launched non leather footwear program thereby addressing the long term demand of industry. In order to address the requirement of the trained personnel FDDI had also launched short term program in the part time mode as well. The short term programs also have the students from Tanzania and Bangladesh as well. There were 47 students training for 6 months training programs and generated Rs. 21.45 Lacs.

In order to improve quality of training, the school conducted faculty upgradation program in the technology notably Biomechanics, Smart footwear technology, ergonomics and similar subjects. A total of 25 personnel were trained during semester break period from FDP. FDDI faculties are also working as counterpart to the professors and academician for new syllabus implementation.

Research and Development- School of Footwear had filed 02 patents in the year 2022-2023 and 13 papers have been published.

#### CONVOCATION OF PASS OUT BATCHES IN SESSION 2022

Convocation for the award of Degree was held for 729 students who passed out in Session 2022 from various campuses of FDDI.

During the 'Designers Fair', a book titled, 'ABC of Footwear Technology' jointly authored by Mr. Varun Gupta, Jr. Consultant- Footwear Technology (FT) and Center Incharge, FDDI Fursatganj and by Mr. A. V. Suresh, Senior Technical Consultant, Romans CAD (Strategies, France) – working in Pune was launched by Mrs. Supriya Sahu, IAS, Additional Chief Secretary to Environment, Climate Change and Forest Department, Government of Tamil Nadu.

'ABC of Footwear Technology', as the name suggests, is the knowledge fragrances of entire 'Footwear Technology' in a single bouquet. It brings practical knowledge along with theoretical aspects with the comprehensive approach. The USP of this book is that, it provides very minute to minute exposure of Footwear Industry through illustrations.

# IMPLEMENTATION OF INTEGRATED DEVELOPMENT OF LEATHER SECTOR (IDLS) SCHEME

FDDI and CLRI are the two arms of Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) working as Project Implementation Unit (PIU) for the Product Sector for the Integrated Development of Leather Sector (IDLS) scheme.

As PIU, FDDI received 338 application for proposed investment of 1004.83 cr and prosed grant Rs. 260.11 cr. During the year, 84 application has been processed and 77 applications were approved with total grant of Rs. 55.59 cr.

#### INTERNATIONAL CONSULTANCY

Under Study in India Scheme of the Government of India, FDDI and Education Consultant of India Ltd., (EdCIL) have extended MoU for 2 years further up to 31st March 2024 for enhancing the reach of FDDI to the international students. Under this scheme, FDDI has offered 125 seats to international students in different programs.

FDDI has developed website targeting international student under Study in India scheme (https://www.studyinindia.gov.in/institute\_details?instituet\_ID=SII-I-0269&active\_tab\_index=0).

FDDI had received 66 applications form the 16 countries from Asia and Africa for the long term programs under Study in India scheme of Government of India. This is second year of the joining of the program and its ongoing. 01 students had joined B.Des. in Footwear Program.

FDDI had also joined the EducationINdia platform of the Ministry of External Affairs for synchronization of the foreign students related activities and expansion of the scope.

Short term training program- FDDI under six month Footwear manufacturing Technology course had received student from Dar –e –Salam University for training on footwear design and production. Beside this, 02 students from Bangladesh had joined the same program.

FDDI has already received admission enquiry for short term program from Nigeria, Tanzania, Bangladesh, Kenya etc.

FDDI will be organizing a short term program in Footwear Design and Pattern Engineering for the design professionals of Leather Goods and Footwear Manufacturing Association of Bangladesh (LGFMAB) at Bangladesh. In this regard, LGFMAB had already confirmed the program in March 2023.

The project related activities has been affected due to COVID and slowly started reverting back. However, FDDI has submitted the proposal to the for the development of the human resource for the footwear industry in Uzbekistan a proposal Design, Development & Delivery of Higher education level Program for Footwear & Leather Products sector in Uzbekistan for long term collaboration with the Uzbekistan Footwear and Leather Product industries. The proposal is under evaluation with the Uzbekistan government.

FDDI had also submitted the proposal to the Ministry of External Affairs under ITEC scheme of the Government of India for Design and Technical Training for Footwear Professionals in Sudan. The proposal is under consideration by the MEA.

Two International projects have been awarded to FDDI worth Rs. 38 lakh by GHERZI Switzerland, German-based Company. The School of Leather Goods and Accessories had been awarded study of "Marketing of Leather Products Manufactured in the Southern African Development Cooperation (SADC) Region". The scope of work is technical assistance to support stakeholders of the regional leather value chain in developing a marketing and sales strategy to strengthen and establish new business linkages within SADC region comprising 5 countries Botswana, Eswatini, Tanzania, South Africa and Zimbabwe.

The activities include conducting a virtual market and marketing assessment of leather product manufacturers in the SADC region, assistance in the design and implementation of a Marketing and Sales Model (MSM) to assist leather product manufacturers in selected countries including an online tracking tool with a minimum of 50 leather product manufacturers from selected countries; Develop a roll out plan taking lessons learnt including focus on brand creation and a promotion strategy for leather products manufactured in SADC.

In addition to the above, expertise is also sought for consultancy services for study of "Increasing market share and turnover of existing manufacturers of leather goods" Tanzania.

The Consultant's technical assistance is sought to support existing manufacturers of leather goods in Tanzania to increase their market share and turnover through conducting market assessment study and using the study to map and develop training programmes. This includes conducting a detailed market assessment of capacities at production level for domestic, regional and export markets for leather products made in Tanzania.

# UPGRADATION OF SOME OF FDDI CAMPUSES AS CENTRES OF EXCELLENCE (CoE)

To take up research and innovation related initiatives 7 campuses has been established as "Centre of Excellence" (CoE) under the Establishment of Institutional Facilities sub-scheme of the Indian Footwear, Leather & Accessories Development Programme of Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT), Government of India.

To meet the cutting edge technologies requirement such as additive manufacturing, AI application in design and data analysis, latest software's, and augmented reality application, digital enterprise, FDDI has already initiated the processes of Industry 4.0 application for footwear sector through setting up of these CoE in different industry verticals at some of its campuses.

These CoEs have been created in different thematic areas such as FDDI Noida - Center for R&D, Course Development and Leather Fashion Footwear & Products Innovation, FDDI Rohtak – Center for Non-Leather Footwear, Products & Accessories, FDDI Jodhpur – Center for High Performance/ Specialized Footwear & Products and Start Ups, FDDI Kolkata - Center for Leather Goods, Garments & Accessories, FDDI Chennai – Center for Design, Development & Fabric Interface, FDDI Hyderabad – Center for Design, Development & Fabric Interface for Leather Products & Accessories- Extended and FDDI Patna - Center for Leather Finishing Innovation & Product Retailing.

These CoEs will provide much needed R&D and address concerns of the industry like product development, technological assistance and centers for incubation and entrepreneurship development. These CoEs are also expected to create R&D capacities in specific areas of specialization to address critical shortage of knowledge base in emerging technologies.

Keeping in view of the future technical requirement and to promote innovation, FDDI is in discussion with various leading institutions for collaboration in the respective thematic areas, across the world.

# 'Study on Fashion Accessories Design: Sustainability Art, Craft, and Design', book edited by Faculties gets published by SCIENG Publications, India





The unique feature of this software is that one can create 2D and 3D view of any design on the same screen. Anything drawn on 2D Design, will be reflected on 3D view which enhance the creativity and visibility of designer and also saves designer's time.

Mind Shoe Design also conducted a contest called Contest '22 with the aim of finding designers interested in using their creativity to find attractive designs. It is a design competition aimed at shoe designers regardless of their level of experience.

Special female footwear that changes its colour in day and night itself

The strips of this special female footwear are basically white, but in sunlight it change into pink. The classic all-white upper is treated with photochromic inks when exposed to sunlight that transform into a patchwork of vibrant colours, making every step radiant. There is a special pigment in the dye used on the footwear which reacts to UV light. This causes the colour of the footwear to change and is called photochromism. The footwear only remains colored when exposed to the Sun.

Under the supervision of Mr. Varun Gupta, Jr. Consultant-Footwear, FDDI, Fursatganj campus, the students of B. Design namely, Ms. Aashi Jain, Ms. Yashashvi Gupta & Mr. Virat Dubey presented research poster on 'Multifunctional and Low-Cost Footwear for Millennial Women' along with the research product named as 'Chameleon Footwear' was also the center of attraction and declared as best research poster.



This footwear has detachable uppers

which can be changed as per the mode and discretion of the wearer. The wearer can adjust the heel height of the footwear as per her choice. As the name suggests the footwear can be changed as per the occasions and the want of the wearer.

This a low-cost footwear having a total of 6 uppers and 3 levels of heel height opens the door to utilize the footwear in 6\*3=18 styles, so the wearer can use the single footwear at the place of having 18 new pair of footwear (i.e. 18 in 1).

The event showcased many nationally renowned fashion designers like, Md. Danish Akhtar, Kolkata and Arti Nehra who presented their cultural




The international webinar was attended by more than 150 participants including students, faculty members, staff members across 12 campuses of FDDI and from other institutions and design community.

He further briefed about the relationship between foot type, foot deformity and effectiveness of footwear with orthosis for deformed foot.

# Hon'ble Minister of Commerce and Industry, Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution and Textiles, Mr. Piyush Goyal interacts with the Heads and Senior Faculty Members of Educational Institutes namely FDDI, IIFT, IIP, NID and NIFT

The Hon'ble Minister of Commerce and Industry, Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution and Textiles (HCIM, CA, F&PD&T), Government of India (GoI), Mr. Piyush Goyal interacted with the Heads and Senior Faculty Members of Educational Institutes namely Footwear Design and Development Institute (FDDI), Indian Institute of Foreign Trade (IIFT), Indian Institute of Packaging (IIP), National Institute of Design (NID) and National Institute of Fashion Technology (NIFT).


The 'Chief Guests' and all the other dignitaries visited the stalls where a display was made by the students of FDDI, NID, NIFT, IIFT and IIP.



'Swachhata Diwas' was held at FDDI campuses on 2nd October 2022.







Md. Rahman – Owner & Director briefed the students about the synthetic materials & products, compounding, mixing, designing, production & marketing.




During the webinar the faculties of SFDP from the campuses of FDDI were connected virtually from the virtual classroom facilities at their respective campuses.

The students visited the Paragon-B footwear unit, which is spread over 16 acres of land and has a large non-leather manufacturing area (upper & assembly). The students were first given a vivid tour of Unit B of the factory, which produces 33,000 pairs per day. After watching various sequence of operation in the unit, the students were led to the quality section, where the soles were tested for flexibility and the final footwear was tested for suitability of fitting, using a last. Furthermore, they were exposed to various sole testing methods.

In the second half, the students were taken to the Paragon unit A having EVA Hawai chapel production unit, with a capacity of 50,000 pairs per day. First, students were taken to the raw material mixing section where they learned about involvement of recycled material (acquired from cutting waste) as one of the major ingredients which, reduced the overall common cost involved in mixing. Further, they witnessed the whole extrusion and sheet building process, and were provided every detail about it.

The students also had an interaction session with the HR, Production Manager, Designer and other front-office executives where their queries were clarified. During the interaction session, Mr. Sreejith Nair, General Manager, Hyderabad Division & his team briefed about quality parameters of safety shoes, career opportunities in non- leather sector, Kaizen Quality Management and Lean Manufacturing, etc.


### 'Photography exhibition-cum-competition' held at FDDI Chhindwara campus

Briefing about this technical article, Ms. Mittal said "Leno weave is created by twisting two warp yarns together, creating a helix-like structure. The weft yarns are interwoven through the gaps created in the twisted warp yarns. I have seen leno weave structures being used to create interesting borders in fabrics however, I tried creating some shapes and motifs in the body of the fabric that led to planning to weave a stole with a huge motif in the middle. I wanted to keep the motif geometrical to have clear visibility and that gave me the idea to use Kasuti motifs."

# Research study of Faculty of FDDI, Hyderabad campus gets published in a book



LEPRA Society is a non-governmental organization that promotes quality health care, initiates and fosters new developments and implementation. It aims to support the National Health Programmes in the prevention and control of diseases such as Leprosy, Lymphatic Filariasis and other neglected diseases.

Its New Nallakunta zone has been actively working since 1988, to help people with leprosy, people with diabetes mellitus and so on. It is also having a shoe manufacturing unit, where they are making footwear with orthoses for people in need.



Key Speaker: Mr. Kameswara Rao, Physiotherapist & Project Officer, LEPRA Society



The morning session of the workshop was conducted by Mr. Kameswara Rao, Physiotherapist & Project Officer, LEPRA Society. He is trained from Central Leprosy Teaching and Research Institute (CLTRI) having more than 33 years of experience in LEPRA Society and has also published several research papers in various international reputed journal.

Mr. Kameswara Rao briefed about the normal physiology of human body & feet, affected patients with anesthetic feet, symptoms and treatment. He further briefed about the relationship between foot type, foot deformity and effectiveness of footwear with orthosis for deformed foot. He also gave an in-depth knowledge of human foot anatomy, functions of feet, importance of Gait cycle for affected feet with various diseases and parameters to be considered for designing of footwear with orthosis. In addition, he explained benefits of Micro Cellulose Rubber (MCR) as shock absorption, capacity of shore hardness, high pressure points and prevention of foot ulcer.

The afternoon session was conducted by Mr. Kameswara Rao and Mr. Devdas.

Mr. Devdas is an artisan-cum-shoe technician having more than 30 years of experience. During this session, the participants received hands-on practice which helped them to acquire good understanding of feet measurement system for deformed feet, support of orthosis pad for supinated, pronated feet and hallux limitus.

The technical workshop was organized with the objective to provide active learning experiences and exposure to the practical tools and skills needed to thrive in professional endeavors.



'8th International Yoga Day' was celebrated with great enthusiasm across all campuses of FDDI by holding Yoga sessions on 21st June, 2022.







To mark its significance and raise awareness about the many benefits of Yoga, the United Nations proclaimed 21st June as the International Day of Yoga in December 2014.

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India on the Accounts of Footwear Design & Development Institute for the year ended 31 March 2023

We have audited the attached Balance sheet of Footwear Design & Development Institute (FDDI) as on 31 March 2023 and the Income and Expenditure Account and Receipt and Payment Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19(2) of the Comptroller and Auditor General's (Duties, Powers and Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 23(2) of the Footwear Design & Development Institute Act, 2017. There are a total of 12 Campuses of FDDI all over India. All 12 campuses (Patna, Kolkata, Jodhpur, Ankaleshwar, Guna, Chhindwara, Noida, Fursatganj, Rohtak, Chandigarh, Hyderabad and Chennai) prepare their own standalone financial statements which are consolidated by FDDI, Noida. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

- 2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules and Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/CAG's Audit reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by the management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 4. Based on our audit, we report that:
- (i) We have obtained all the information and explanations which, to the best of our knowledge and belief, were necessary for the purpose of our audit;
- (ii) The Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Account/ Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format prescribed by the Ministry of Finance.
- (iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by FDDI, Noida in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- (iv) We further report that:

#### **COMMENTS ON ACCOUNTS**

#### A.Balance Sheet

#### A.1Current liabilities and Provisions (Schedule-7): 51.74 crore

The above amount does not include outstanding demand of Noida Authority amounting to 11.14 crore towards lease rent for the allotted land along with interest as on 31 March 2023.

FDDI requested (February 2022 and May 2022) Noida Authority to waive off the interest amount on the plea that it did not have surplus fund to pay the outstanding amount. However, the Authority rejected the request of FDDI in March 2022 and July 2022 stating that the lease rent and interest was payable by FDDI as per the terms and conditions of the lease agreement and there was provision for waiver of interest. Despite this, the outstanding demand was not provided for in the books of accounts as on 31 March 2023 although it was disclosed as a contingent liability.

Non-provisioning of the outstanding demand of Noida Authority resulted in understatement of Current Liabilities and Provisions, understatement of Other Administrative Expenses and consequent understatement of Excess of income over expenditure (Deficit) by 11.14 crore.

# A.2 Earmarked/Endowment Fund (Schedule-3): 559.45 crore Capital Grant: 534.36 crore

- (i) The above represents closing balance of Capital Grants received by FDDI from Government, out of which 532.88 crore has been utilised for creation of assets upto 31 March 2023 leaving untilised balance of Rs. 1.48 crore (534.36 crore *minus* 532.88 crore). However, amount of 531.45 crore has been depicted as the Net Block of Fixed Assets which was created out of Government Grants (vide Schedule-8B). Thus, a difference of 1.43 crore (532.88 crore *minus* 531.45 crore) existed between Assets created out of Government Grants and the capitalised Government Grants and as on 31 March 2023. Despite assurances given during the previous years, i.e., 2018-19, 2019-20, 2020-21 and 2021-22, the difference has not yet been reconciled.
- (ii) As per Schedule-3, an amount of 70.15 crore was deducted from Capital Grants on account of capital expenditure on fixed assets. As per Schedule-8B, depreciation on fixed assets was shown as 69.32 crore which also included the amount of depreciation of 2.45 crore under Placement Linked Skill Development Programme (PLSDP) fund. Thus, the amount adjusted under Capital Grants should have been shown as 66.87 crore (69.32 crore minus 2.45 crore) instead of 70.15 crore and the remaining amount of 3.28 crore should have been shown under the head Revenue Expenditure as it pertained to recurring expenditure on machines/expenditure on licenses and software/training aid/professional charges etc. (2.21 crore) and interest returned (paid) to the Government (1.07 crore).
- (iii) Depreciation charged on assets created out of Capital Grants and PLSDP Grant should have also been shown separately in Schedule-8B of the financial statements. However, the same was not disclosed separately.

#### A.3 Current Assets, Loans, Advances, etc. (Schedule-11): 46.55 crore Other Assets: Student Fee Receivbles: 5.58 crore

The above includes Student Fee Receivable of 3.26 crore pertaining to Chhindwara Campus out of which 42.50 lakh was pending for more than three years. The chances of recovery of this amount was remote as the students had left the course between the course duration due to some disputes, as intimated by the Management. However, despite giving assurance by the Management of Chhindwara Campus during the audit for the year 2021-22, provision for this amount has not been created during 2022-23 as well.

This resulted in overstatement of 'Student Fee Receivables' and understatment of 'Provision for doubtful debts' as well as understatement of 'Deficit carried to Corpus/Capital Fund' to the tune of 42.50 lakh.

#### B. Grant-in-Aid

As certified by FDDI, it had an unspent balance of Capital Grant of 78.09 crore under Centers of Excellence (COE) and Computer Networking Center (CNC) Projects as on 1 April 2022. The Government of India has given Nil grants to FDDI during the year 2022-23. Out of the total unspent balance, FDDI utilised an amount of 76.70 crore. Further, FDDI earned interest of 1.15 crore on the grants during the year 2022-23 and refunded interest of 1.07 crore. The closing balance of Grant as on 31 March 2023 was 1.60 crore (of CNC Grant). The closing balance of Grant as maintained in dedicated bank accounts was 4.72 crore (including 3.12 crore on account of retention money, liquidated damages deducted from contractors, and claiming of FDDI own fund).

#### C. Management Letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in this Separate Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Management of the Institute through a Management Letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

- (i) Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Account/Receipt and Payment Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- (ii) In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in **Annexure** to this Separate Audit Report, give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India:

#### **Annexure to Separate Audit Report**

#### 1. Adequacy of Internal Audit System

Internal Audit was being done by hired Chartered Accountants' firm namely RSM & Associates and the same had been completed up to the financial year 2022-23 for all the campuses.

#### 2. Adequacy of Internal Control System

The internal control system was inadequate and not commensurate with the size and nature of the activities of FDDI in so far as financial matters are concerned due to the reasons mentioned below:

- (a) Sundry creditors of 31.19 lakh and Sundry debtors of 1.24 crore were pending/outstanding for settlement for more than three years. Balance confirmation with clients/ debtors was also not found on records.
- (b) Scrutiny of vouchers revealed that Authorization signature and maker-checker rules were not followed, voucher number and date in tally software were not matching with the hard copy of vouchers.
- (d) 'Expenditure pertaining to other than Centre of Excellence (COE) grant was booked under Group summary named 'Govt Grant COE'.
- (e) Demat account statement for confirmation of balance of Bonds as on 31.3.2023 was not found in the records.
- (f) Register of Assets in prescribed format along with expenditure control register, Advance register, TA and LTC bill register, Medical claims expenditure register, Library accession/issue register, Stationary register, Investment register, Register of contracts, Grants-in-aid register were not maintained by the Institute.

#### 3. System of Physical Verification of Fixed Assets

Physical verification of fixed assets had been completed by the Management for all campuses. However, in the Assets register as furnished by the Management, non-working assets were mentioned but the value of each asset and value of non-working assets were not disclosed.

#### 4. System of Physical Verification of Inventory

Physical verification of the inventory had been completed by the Management for all campuses and no discrepancy was found.

#### 5. Regularity in Payment of Statutory Dues

The Institute was regular in payment of statutory dues during the year 2022-23.

### Schedule-24: Significant Accounting Policies

#### 1. Basis of preparation of financial statements:

- (a) The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the historical Cost conventions.
- (b) Accounting policies not specifically referred to otherwise are consistent with generally Accepted accounting principles followed by this institute.
- (c) The items of income & expenditure are recognized on accrual basis.

#### 2. Fixed Assets:

- (a) Fixed Assets purchased/created are stated at cost of acquisition less accumulated depreciation. The cost of acquisition is inclusive of freight, duties, taxes and other essential expenses.
- (b) Following lands have been allotted free of cost by the respective state govt. and the same have been shown in the Books of Accounts at a nominal value of Re 1/- each.
  - Land for FDDI Branch at Chennai, Tamilnadu
  - Land for FDDI Branch at Kolkata, West Bengal
  - Land for FDDI Branch at Rohtak, Haryana
  - Land for FDDI Branch at Jodhpur, Rajasthan
  - Land for FDDI Branch at Hyderabad
  - Land for FDDI Branch at Patna, Bihar
  - Land for FDDI Branch at Banur, Punjab

#### 3. Depreciation:

The Depreciation has been charged during the current financial year 2022-23 on all the Assets purchased and created out of the Govt. The Total Depreciation charged during the current year on the assets was Rs. 69,32,36,207/- and the grant was adjusted against the same value. Further the depreciation charged on Assets purchased out of the own fund amounting to Rs.2,24,41,903/- /- shown in the Income & Expenditure Account. As per the Policy, no depreciation has been provided on the capital expenditure incurred during the year 2022-23 relating to the capital work in progress since they were not capitalized till the date of Balance Sheet.

#### 4. Investments:

Both long term and Short-term investments are valued at cost as on the date of the Balance Sheet.

#### 5. Inventories:

As certified by the department heads, the inventories are valued at cost.

#### 6. Revenue Recognition:

All the income are accounted for on accrual basis except Grant/subsidy, which was shown as part of income to the extent of depreciation charged to the Assets purchased out of the Govt Grant.

#### 7. Expenditure:

All the expenditure was booked on accrual basis. During the year 2022-23, the expenditure booked on account of provision for Leave encashment of Rs.14,90,230/. The total provision for Leave Encashment is Rs.5,81,43,082/- and provision for Gratuity is Rs.7,69,05,502/- as on 31.03.2023, out of which a sum of Rs. 7,44,84,555/- is invested in the LIC Group Gratuity Scheme.

#### 8. Capitalization of Work in Progress:

During the year Rs. 5,49,07,261/- (IDLS Rs.4,74,929/-, CNC Rs.14,89,585/- & COE Rs.5,29,42,747/-) was shown as Capital Work in Progress towards the expenditure incurred for setting up of Centre of Excellence (COEs) in FDDI's Branches at Patna, Jodhpur, Kolkata, Rohtak, Chennai & Hyderabad and CNC and IDLS-Noida

#### 9. Excess/shortfall of Income over expenditure:

As an Organization's Policy, the Excess of Expenditure over Income of Rs 13,36,81,813/has been transferred to Capital/Corpus Fund.

#### 10. Grants in AID:

During the current year FDDI received Grant to the tune of Rs. NIL/- and earned income out of the grant of Rs. 1,15,79,009/-. The grant utilized/adjusted against depreciation on Assets purchased out of the Grant of Rs. 69,32,36,207/- and other recurring administrative expenditure of Rs. NIL/-.

- i) Balance of stocks & cash have been taken as certified by HODs & physically verified by them on 31/03/2023.
  - ii) The balance of sundry debtors, creditors, receivable, loans & advances & other liabilities whether in debit or in credit are subject to confirmation and reconciliation.
  - iii) The Institute has appointed the firm of Chartered Accountants to conduct their Internal Audit regularly for all the branches and HO. We have made the books of accounts of all the branches as audited by the Internal Auditor.
  - iv)) All the financial figures have been rounded off to the nearest rupee while completing the financial statements.
  - vi) Previous year figures have been regrouped and rearranged wherever it was necessary.
  - vii) Fixed Assets (related to project) of all branches are maintained at head office.

### **Schedule: 25 Contingent Liabilities**

i) Contingent Liabilities: The NOIDA Authority has issued a letter dated 12.05.2023 demanding Rs. 11.13 Crore as Lease Rent of Land & Interest thereon for Noida Campus. In this regard it is submitted that the Lease Rent has been paid up to the date but interest is due on delay payment of Lease rent. The matter is being taken up with the Noida for waiving off of Interest, however authority has agreed to waive off penalty and agreed to charge saving interest rate instead of 17% and letter of confirmation yet to be received from authority.


