At Guda Bishnoi village, the students learned about world's strongest and famous Panja Dari weaving technique from Mr. Mohammad Hasam, a renowned artisan. Panja Dari is now innovatively also being used in making lifestyle goods such as bags, upholstery and other interior products.

Further, the students learned about world famous Bagru Dying from Mr. Haider Ali, a master artisan. Bagru Dying is 100% natural resist dying & printing technique used in making variety of home linen and apparel material.

Students also visited Kankani village and tried their hands on terracotta pottery. They enjoyed making small pots, pitchers and

figurines with clay. Master artisan Mr. Nizamuddin shared some of his ideas about the pottery art. These products are made with fine terracotta clay that are then glazed or unglazed and then baked in fire. This is a natural and sustainable technique which is evolving with time.
