
Next big thing in fashion

We asked Tasha a few questions about her journey as an aspiring fashion designer and here's what she had to say.


- 1) What is your way of reaching a solution? What sustainable changes do you wish to see in the industry?

- 2) Tell us a little about your thought process for the two competitions.




SNEHASINI AS MOANA





BOOK RECOMMENDATION



2001: A Space Odyssey
Directed by: Stanley Kubrick

Release date: 2 April 1968

2001: A Space Odyssey is an epic science fiction film produced and directed by Stanley Kubrick. The screenplay was written by Kubrick and Arthur C. Clarke and was inspired by Clarke's 1951 short story "The Sentinel" and some of his other short stories. The film is noted for its scientifically accurate depiction of space flight, pioneering special effects, and ambiguous imagery. Kubrick avoided conventional cinematic and narrative techniques; dialogue is used sparingly, and there are long sequences accompanied only by music. In the prehistoric African veldt, a tribe of hominids is driven away from its water hole by a rival tribe. Later, they awaken to find an alien monolith has appeared in their midst. Influenced by the monolith, they discover how to use a bone as a weapon and, after their first hunt, return to drive their rivals away with the newly discovered tool. This movie is a must watch for all Sci-Fi fans of outer space.

TYPES OF FICTION - MEGHNA MENON K

Fiction is a literary work based on imagination or a reality we create to feed our desires.

Fantasy- A story that can't happen in real life, typically involving magic, supernatural powers, or a dreamy universe.

Folklore- A collection of fictional tales of animals, people, and cultural myths passed down from generations.emerged from culture and passed on from centuries.

Historical- A fictional story set up based on historical events, that present the past in a creative way.

Mystery – Also called detective fiction; involving a detective solving a case from start to finish or the journey of untangling the truth.

Realistic fiction- Placing imaginary characters in a real-life setting and experiencing fiction with a touch of reality.

Romance- Stories involving a romantic relationship between two people, embracing the unspoken vows of the heart.

Science fiction- Principally deals with the impact of actual or imagined science upon society or individuals. Technology taking over the human realm.

Thriller/Suspense- Plot-driven stories that are tense and exciting because of the unknown.

Horror- The main plot revolves around something scary or terrifying. It feeds on your fears and curiosity.

THE SIN OF PRIDE -PAULINE SKYE

Often when Believers think of the first sin, they think of Adam and Eve and the Fall in the Garden of Eden. While this is indeed the first human sin, it is not the first recorded sin in the Scripture. As a biblical story, we know that the serpent tempted Eve, but we often forget that the devil's fall from grace was what set the stage for humankind's fall, both as antecedent and type.

Let's catch a glimpse of Satan's fall and the First Sin.

From the Holy Bible: Isaiah14: 12-15 it is obvious that Satan's (the serpent)sin was pride. He was so beautiful, so wise, and so powerful as an angel that he began to covet God's position and authority. He chafed at having to serve God and grew angry and rebellious. He did not want to serve, he wanted to be served; he, as a creature, wanted to be worshipped. How starkly contrasted to our savior Jesus Christ, who came not to be ministered unto, but to minister and to give his life a ransom for many.

It is evident that pride literally went before the fall, both the fall of Satan (the serpent) and the fall of man. Pride causes shame, loss of wisdom, destruction, and ruin. If one were to summarize what actually happened as Adam and Eve were kicked out of the Garden of Eden, would not these passages describe their mental and physical condition exactly? The shame of committing a sin against God, physical disease, pain and death looming on the horizon, loss of fellowship with God, and the fight to eke out a living from the cursed ground—all these are the outworking of the sin of pride.





Our guest speaker is Mr. Hitendra Katiyar, an alumnus of IIT Bombay, who has worked for HSBC, OLA, and is currently working at Rippling. He is heavily associated with FTV as an independent Director of Pageants. FTV is an international brand that broadcasts fashion and lifestyle events, and the platform has featured several very big brands such as Fendi, Chanel, Versace, and Jean Paul Gaultier.



How did you make a transition into the fashion industry? What about the industry intrigued you?

To be honest I haven't fully made the transition yet but I'm holding my hands in multiple buckets. This is something that came to me first in 2009. The first event I attended was organized by the college festival organizing committee called Mood Indigo. he production of the event was amazing and I decided this is what I want to do.

I dedicated my next three years of college being part of that committee and organized multiple events there. Right out of college I was part of a start-up. I wanted to broaden my scope internationally, with people from different backgrounds and cultures. Going to a new industry always comes with a challenge but being able to do something for the community or for my friends and family continuously motivates me. It's not tiring. I'm still young and I have a lot of energy to invest in everything I get my hands on.

What is your opinion on the inclusion of various body types and how far would you say FTV has come with respect to body positivity?

FTV as a brand does not dictate how we run this whole thing in India, but they support the way we want to run it. Our core belief is that becoming a model is basically like becoming a salesman. As a model, once you become successful you are basically selling things to your sponsors, and over time the industry has realized that you don't have to put your body on display or have it be a certain colour or type. I think we have moved past those standards, and it is seen in all our events. Social media has also democratized a part of this, so that is helpful.

How do you think pageantry has evolved over the decades?

I used to think it was only reserved for people who look a certain way, have certain characteristics or are from certain places, but now I see people from good colleges and people from different professions coming in, be it lawyers, doctors, engineers, or others. So I feel that it's more welcoming and liberal now. What are some challenges that come with being the Director of Pageantry? What advice would you give to someone who wants to be a Director of Pageantry?

My personal challenge has been time management. I have to work with multiple teams. There is a registration team that takes care of the registration and other formalities and restrictions; another team that builds all the infrared that we promise our registrants and so on.

So it's about making sure that everything is available and running smoothly like a skillful process. I think one learns this only by doing it over a period of time.

In your pageantry, what do you look for during the selection of the panel of judges?

I have been watching a lot of events to learn about how they are run and what sort of people judge them. At the core of it they must be experienced in that field to be able to judge other people, provide the feedback, maintain professionalism and be passionate about the industry. So we look for their expertise in the field before getting in touch with them to be a judge.

CORSETS: A TOOL OF OPPRESSION OR A MEN LED PROPAGANDA? -RIDHISHA MANIKONDA

With corsets making a comeback in 2020-21 fashion as part of the escapist cottage core aesthetic, the narrative of corsets being an oppressive tool that women were forced upon by men arises.

However, history says otherwise.

Corsets were invented by Roxey Ann Caplin in the 19th century but its concept has existed since the 16th century when Queen Catherine De Medici introduced it in France and called it "Stays". These stays were created with whalebone sewed into them to shape the bodice, provide back support and uplift the chest.

Cut to the 19th century, it was labeled 'vain and foolish' by men and members of the Victorian Dress Reform claiming that women were restricted from performing their "womanly" duties of cleaning and taking care of children. Medical experts claimed that these corsets damaged lungs, rearranged organs, and compromised fertility.

However, at closer inspection, it was revealed that the problem was with the concept of tight-lacing and not corsets itself. Tightlacing is a waist training practice where women whose waist size was 24 inches were cinched to 5 inches. The harmful effects of tightlacing were obvious whereas an average corset would reshape a 24-inch waist to 22-inches and were known for improving posture, relieving headaches, and back pain.

Custom made by women, corsets were well-tailored and weren't supposed fee suffocating, instead were supposed to support posture to carry layers of clothing and elaborate gowns of the time. Fashion back then was reigned by women who owned boutiques and designed corsets, so why would it be forced upon women by men? Youtuber Karoline Zebrowski answers this in her videos. She has a video of herself doing regular activities like running around, doing pushups, and climbing trees all while wearing a corset and states countless examples that women's movement wasn't "restricted" by

The film Pirates of the Caribbean shows Keira Knightley's character fainting because of a tight corset, she also reveals in an interview that it was uncomfortable to wear. Ironically, she continued to feature in period films. Actresses like Emma Stone, Lily James, and Dakota Fanning have also shared their discomfort with corsets. When Emma Watson refused to wear a corset in her film Beauty and the Beast there was a backlash from fashion critics that her costumes looked historically inaccurate. Corsets are highly intricate to make, require multiple fittings, and need "breaking in". It needs to be worn for a few hours a day until the body adjusts to it but the modern film production schedule doesn't allow this, so it's natural for actresses to get overwhelmed when they wear it directly on the shoot.

The only time corsets were oppressive was in the late 19th century due InèsGachesSarraute, a man who made the "S-line" corset which forced women to adopt an exaggerated S shape posture by pushing their hips back.

Corsets have had a complicated history with the modern world as the later decades of the 20th century slowly replaced corsets with more practical and freeing pieces of clothing. One must remember that back then people dressed for social inclusion and weren't free to follow multiple styles so it's unfair to demonize the corset without understanding the context of the time it existed. By the late20th century designers like Vivienne Westwood and Jean Paul Gaultier emerged by bringing back corsets and incorporating them into modern aesthetics. Celebrities like Madonna and Nicole Kidman wore corsets to embrace their femininity, this symbolism repeats itself in a post-modernist society today.

If you've been following tech news lately, you may have noticed a new app called Clubhouse that's getting a lot of attention.


Students' Array posted a poll on Instagram asking students which app they preferred- Clubhouse or Omegle. With a maximum number of votes, Clubhouse took the crown!


