The festival o Ganesh Chaturthi, with its colors of delight and flavors of culture started with the initiative of a few and soon flowed through everyone's heart.
















All the students were dressed up in a traditional attire.

All the performers danced with their passion and set the stage on fire.


Singers, guitarists, and a flautist showcased their talents and passion during Ibtida.

A live show was performed by @danishmohmamd on the first day of Ibtida.



INDIAN CINEMA DAY








