

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

The copyrights were officially granted on 29 January 2026, recognizing the originality and intellectual contribution of the creators Certificate- bhil briksh




Milan Fashion Week Men's (Jan 16–20): Featured over 76 appointments, including Prada and major presentations focused on F/W 2026-27, with a strong emphasis on "provisional" shows, such as Meryll Rogge's debut at Marni and Maria Grazia Chiuri's first Fendi collection.



Source Fashion, London (Jan 13–15): Held at Olympia London, focusing on "Analogue Futures," with a new "Fashion Deconstructed" zone highlighting repair, upcycling, and responsible sourcing, featuring over 250 international exhibitors.



FOOTWEAR HIGHLIGHTS- JANUARY 2026

Footwear India Expo 2026 (New Delhi): Scheduled for 29–31 January 2026 at Pragati Maidan, this 22nd edition served as a major B2B platform connecting manufacturers with wholesalers, distributors, and material suppliers. It featured a comprehensive display of finished footwear, machinery, and components, with a strong focus on enhancing domestic and international growth.



Leather Fashion Show & Brand Symposium (Chennai): Held on January 29, 2026, this event showcased innovative designs from 14 major manufacturers to a global market, with a focus on boosting exports following the India-EU Free Trade Agreement.



India-EU Free Trade Agreement (FTA): Concluded on January 30, 2026, this deal is expected to eliminate up to 17% duty on leather and footwear products, boosting exports to the EU market.

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
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
